## WHY A BEQUEST TO PYNSW?

It is a lasting legacy that will have an impact for Christ for generations to come. Having an effective youth ministry is key to the long-term growth of the Presbyterian Church in NSW.

Quality training of young people now will result in men and women serving Christ for their lifetime, and they in turn will raise up the next generation to make disciples of Jesus. It is our prayer that this will continue until the day of His glorious return.

You may not have the means now to support PYNSW, but a bequest will reflect the partnership you have with this important ministry.

## IS IT COMPLICATED?

No: if you don't yet have a will, it may be time to get one!

You are never too young to ensure that your family and others are properly provided for. This may be the perfect time to think about which ministries you would like to support through a bequest.

If you have a current will, your solicitor will advise you how to amend it.

## HOW DO BEQUESTS WORK?

Options for leaving a bequest to PYNSW include:

- 1) Giving a specific amount of money
- 2) Giving a percentage of your estate
- 3) A residual bequest is a gift of whatever remains of your estate after family and other commitments have been fulfilled.



## HOW SHOULD IT BE WORDED IN MY WILL?

### 1. To give a specific amount to PYNSW:

I give and bequeath the sum of \$..... to Presbyterian Youth, being an organisation of the Presbyterian Church in New South Wales, for its general purposes.

### 2. To give a percentage to PYNSW:

I give and bequeath .....per cent of my estate to Presbyterian Youth, being an organisation of the Presbyterian Church in New South Wales.

### 3. To give the remainder of your estate to PYNSW:

After the foregoing provisions of my will for my family and friends have been carried out I give the residue of my estate to Presbyterian Youth, being an organisation of the Presbyterian Church in New South Wales.

## ABOUT PYNSW

Our core purpose:

***Through God's strength PYNSW aims to equip the Church to disciple all youth for Christ.***

Originally constituted in 1872 as the Presbyterian Fellowship Union, Presbyterian Youth (PY) was also formerly known as The Presbyterian Fellowship of Australia in NSW; and remains the youth organisation of the Presbyterian Church of Australia in NSW.

Its aims are:

- ⇒ to present to youth the Gospel of Jesus Christ as the only way of salvation and call them to an obedient acceptance of Christ as Saviour and Lord;
- ⇒ to help youth to mature in their understanding of the life, death, resurrection, and teaching of Christ through study of the Bible, prayer and fellowship; and encourage youth to commit themselves to Him as Lord,
- ⇒ to join the membership of the Church and devote their lives to the service of God.
